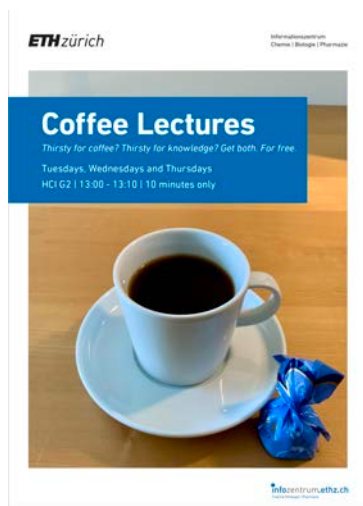

We will demonstrate the new Biosequences Search that has recently been included in SciFinder<sup>n</sup>. Over 550 million sequence-patent relationships and 23 million sequences from non-patent literature are searchable using BLAST, CDR and a motif search.
